



- QUARTERLY AUDIT- As the quarterly financial audits are coming due, it has been suggested, as they are completed, to have another Base member's review to verify all information is within good practices. Also mentioned was investigating into the possibility of Codifying the Budget into the Bylaws.
- HAMPTON ROADS BASE ANNUAL
 <u>PICNIC</u>- The decision was made to put out a request to attending members at the SUBVETS meeting for a committee to come together and get more members involved in the picnic decision-making process.
- <u>USS NORFOLK SAIL</u>- The decision is to meet with the Norfolk Sail Committee for progress details and to discuss future funding including what HRB will contribute and when.

 to reinvigorate this program and bring it back to
 life. The Quarterly Khaki Social is a major
 recruiting tool. Ken Swan will be communicating
 with officials at SUBLANT about this program
 idea. To restart the program, we may look at a

- OPEN FORUM- It has been noted with all things discussed, more involvement needs to happen. Ideas are needed for new members to be sought out for all items mentioned to be a success.

Boats Lost in the Month of September

USS S-5 (SS-110)

Lost on September 1st, 1920, when a practice dive went wrong and she sank bow-first, with her stern showing above the water. In a dramatic adventure, her exhausted crew was rescued during the next few days. Salvage attempts were unsuccessful, S-5 settled to the bottom and was abandoned.



USS S-51 (SS-162)

Lost on September 25th, 1925, with the loss of 33 men when it was sunk after collision with SS CITY OF ROME off Block Island.

USS GRAYLING (SS-209)

Lost on September 9th, 1943, with the loss of 76 men near the Tablas Strait. GRAYLING was on her 8th war patrol and sank two ships before being lost.

USS POMPANO (SS-181)

POMPANO was sunk between September 17th and October 5th, 1943, with the loss of 77 men while on her 7th war patrol. Possibly lost on September 17th. Japanese records show that a submarine was sunk in her patrol area on 17 September by an air & depth charge attack off of the Aomori Prefecture near Shiriya-Zaki. Before being lost, she sank two enemy cargo ships. The exact cause of her loss remains unknown, but she probably was sunk by the air/sea attack above or fell victim to a mine on or after September 25th. This boat's last recorded ship (Taiko Maru) sunk happened on September 25th, so she probably hit a mine on or after that date but before October 5th, when she was scheduled back at Midway.

USS CISCO (SS-290)

Lost on September 28th, 1943, on her first war patrol with the loss of 76 men in the Sulu Sea west of Mindanao.

New veterans' care center to open soon in Virginia Beach; Gov. Youngkin tours facility

13News Now - July 26, 2022

On his first trip to the site as Virginia's governor, Glenn Youngkin visited the soon-to-open Jones and Cabacoy Veterans Care Center near Virginia Beach's municipal complex. "It's the idea that we should want our veterans to stay here and not move away, where in fact Virginia is better off because our veterans are here," he told a crowd of eager visitors. This year, one chapter closes but another begins after a years-long journey in the city. State and city leaders first broke ground on the center in 2017 under then-Governor Terry McAullife. The 128-bed inpatient care facility is designed to provide nursing care, memory care, and more for the region's veterans. Now, the building is months away from opening for its first patients. "There will be four veteran care centers around the Commonwealth: one in Roanoke, Richmond, one here opening soon, and one that looks exactly like it in Fauquier County. These four facilities provide most needed support and care." Governor Youngkin received a tour of the facility alongside the First Lady of Virginia, saying the resources in place to improve simple aspects of life some others may take for granted is what sets this effort apart for the region's veterans. "I just was in what will be a full functioning gym with a most important attribute, an automobile, there to help veterans with the simple task of getting in and out of a car. Think about how important that is: independence, self-sufficiency, and pride come with the ability to take care of yourself, getting in and out of your car and driving somewhere," he said. The center's name honors the lives of two war heroes: Colonel William Jones III and Sergeant Christopher Cabacoy, both from the Hampton Roads area. Governor Youngkin also ceremoniously donated a quarter of his yearly salary to the Virginia Veterans Services Foundation.

Recent drills with US Navy missile subs show how Marine special operators would get to the frontline in a fight against China.

- Recent US Navy-Marine Corps drills highlight an overlooked method of getting operators on target.
- The drills involved Marines launching from submarines, which can be done on the surface or underwater.
- These kinds of submarine operations are harder for enemies to detect but come with inherent risks.

How it's done and why it's risky

However, as with most special-operations infiltration and exfiltration methods, submarine operations come with a lot of risk. Combat diving generally has significant physical risk, which only increases when a nuclear-powered submarine is involved.

"The risks include significant physiological risks while conducting submarine lock in, lock out and closed-circuit diving operation due to complicated pressure changes in the operation," said Galvin, who is the author of "A Few Bad Men," an account of the first Marine special operations combat deployment to Afghanistan and how it overcame attacks from all sides.

The lock-in and lock-out technique is used to get operators into and out of a submerged submarine undetected by enemy eyes or sensors. The Navy has a certain number of submarines with specially designed "lock-out trunks."

At the release point, the operators enter the lock-out trunk wearing their scuba gear and the trunk is flooded to match the outside water pressure. Once the appropriate pressure is reached, the operators open the trunk's hatch and head to their target, taking with them any necessary gear, such as inflatable boats.

Throughout this procedure, the submarine remains submerged but close to the surface.

During lock-out operations, commandos have to be very careful with their air levels and ensure that the air in the trunk doesn't have too much carbon dioxide, which can be deadly for the operators and compromise the mission, as too much of the gas can create bubbles that an adversary can pick up with sonar.

Lockouts are no piece of cake, and lots can go wrong during the process, especially when there are operational restrictions — for example, operating at night and the general need for secrecy.

Mistakes under those conditions "can result in convulsions, hypoxia, decompression sickness, as well as becoming disoriented, navigational errors, exhaustion, oxygen toxicity, severe cramps (especially during cold-weather diving operations) and equipment malfunctions, which can lead to not being able to have the entire team continue the subsurface mission," Galvin said.

Some of those side effects can appear after the subsurface phase of the infiltration or exfiltration and can even lead to long-term effects for the operators affected.

Submarine-borne infiltration and exfiltration "has one of the highest operational-risk assessments of all special-operations missions and requires highly trained, specialized diving medical technicians, diving medical officers to operate decompression chambers, and training on submarine chamber operations," Galvin added.
