prosperous year. May your joys be many and your sorrows few.



We remember.... We Honor





USS S-36 (SS 141): Lost on January 20, 1942 with no loss of life, on her 2nd war patrol. She ran hard aground on a reef and radioed for help. The entire crew was rescued by a Dutch ship after they scuttled

her.







USS S-26 (SS 131): Lost on January 24, 1942 with



the loss of 46 officers and men in the Gulf of Panama, on her 2nd war patrol. She was rammed by the USS PC-460 and sunk within seconds. The CO, XO, and one lookout on the bridge, were the only survivors.

USS ARGONAUT (SS 166): Lost on January 10,



1943 with the loss of 102 officers and men of Rabaul, on her 3rd war patrol. While attacking a convoy, she torpedoed a Japanese destroyer who along with 2 other destroyers depth charged her. As she tried to surface, the destroyers sunk her by gunfire.

USS SCORPION (SS 278): Lost on January 5, 1944



with the loss of 77 officers and men in the East China Sea, on her 4th war patrol. It is assumed she was sunk by a mine.

USS SWORDFISH (SS 193): Lost on January 12,



1945 with the loss of 89 officers and men somewhere near Okinawa, on her 13th war patrol. Probably was lost to a mine.



Hall of Fame Selection

This year's winner: USS Spearfish (SS-190).





Spearfish was launched on 29 October 1937 at





Electric Boat, and commissioned on 17 July 1938 under the command of Lieutenant C.E. Tolman, Jr.

She was in Manila Bay on 7 December (8 December Manila time) and almost immediately went on her first war patrol. She started her second patrol 7 February from Surabaja, Java. Partly thru that patrol she embarked 12 members of the Asiatic Submarine Fleet staff for transport to Freemantle Australia.

On her third patrol she sank two Marus. Then on 23 May she went in to Corregidor to evacuate 27 people including several nurses. She was the last submarine to visit Corregidor prior to its capture by the Japanese.

Spearfish made a total of ten war patrols. On her last patrol from 12 November 1944 to 24 January 1945 she did photo recon of Iwo Jima and nearby Minami Jima. On 19 December she was assigned to lifeguard duty for a B-29 strike on the home islands. That day she made the first submarine rescue of a downed B-29 crew. Seven of the plane's crew of eleven were picked up and transported to Saipan.

Spearfish returned to Mare Island on 27 August 1945. Subsequently, she was decommissioned on 22 June 946. Her scrapping occurred in October 1947.

January Historic Events

Jan 1909: Ship Fitter First Class George H. Wheeler and Boatswains Mate William H. Gowan display bravery and extraordinary heroism while fighting a hotel fire and keeping it from spreading in Coquimbo, Chile. For their actions on this occasion, both men are awarded the Medal of Honor.

22 Jan 1941: During World War II, USS Louisville (CA 28) arrives at New York with \$148,342.212.55 in British gold brought from Simons Town, South Africa, to be deposited in American banks.

27 Jan 1942: Submarine USS Gudgeon (SS211) becomes the first US Navy submarine to sink an enemy Japanese submarine in action during World War II.

4 Jan 1943: USS Shad (SS 235) sinks German minesweeper M 4242 (ex-French trawler Odet II) in the Bay of Biscay.

14 Jan 1943: USS Gudgeon (SS 211) lands six men, 2,000 pounds of equipment and supplies on Negros Island for first resupply mission for a submarine.

5 Jan 1944: USS Omaha (CL 4) and USS Jouett (DD 396) were summoned to engage the German blockade runner Burgenland under the guise of SS Rio Grande. Gunfire and scuttling charges, sank the German ship.

14 Jan 1944: Five U.S. Navy submarines sink five different Japanese vessels in and around the Pacific Ocean. USS Albacore (SS 218) sinks Japanese destroyer Sazanami 300 miles off Yap; USS Scamp (SS 277) sinks the tanker Nippon Maru off Sorol Island; USS Guardfish (SS 217) sinks tanker Kenyo Maru southeast of Palau; USS Seawolf (SS 197) sinks tanker Yamazuru Maru off Okinawa, and USS Swordfish (SS 193) sinks transport Yamakuni Maru off Hachijo Jima.



22 Jan 1961: USS George Washington (SSBN 598) completes the first operational voyage as a fleet ballistic missile submarine, staying submerged 66 days.

USS Arizona and USS Oklahoma to Sail Again, Navy's Acting Secretary Says

Navy ships named USS Arizona and USS Oklahoma will return to active duty with the announcement by Acting Secretary of the Navy Thomas Modly that two new Virginia-class attack submarines will be named after American heroes of the greatest generation who perished on the famed Pearl Harbor battleships.

The move brings back into service the hallowed ship names 78 years after both were badly damaged in the surprise Japanese attack on Dec. 7, 1941. Most of the Navy casualties that day came from losses on those two ships.

"I am honored and humbled to name the next two Virginia-class nuclear fast-attack submarines to be built as the USS Oklahoma (SSN-802) and the USS Arizona (SSN-803), "Modly said in a release. "It is my fondest wish that the citizens of the great states of Arizona and Oklahoma will understand and celebrate our Navy's desire to memorialize the 1, 177 heroes who perished in USS Arizona (BB-39) and the 429 more in USS Oklahoma (BB-37) in Pearl Harbor, on Dec. 7, 1941."

Modly added that "there is no greater honor I can think of for the Navy, the Marine Corps, and the nation than to build and commission into active service two state-of-the-art American warships carrying the spirit of those heroes of the greatest generation, as well as that of their families and the Grand Canyon and Sooner states as they sail through a new American maritime century."

Approximately 1.8 million people annually visit the Pearl Harbor National Memorial, which includes the USS Arizona, USS Oklahoma and USS Utah memorials, six officer bungalows, three mooring quays, and the Pearl Harbor Visitor Center.

"Today is a proud day for Arizona," Arizona Gov. Doug Ducey said in a release. "It's been nearly 80 years since the attacks on Pearl Harbor, which resulted in the sinking of the USS Arizona and deaths of 1, 177 of her crewmembers. This ship and the name, 'USS Arizona, 'hold special meaning for our country, its history and the people of Arizona--and today, that legacy begins a new chapter."

Putin wants to build up Russian Navy's combat potential in coming years

The Russian Navy should build up its combat potential in coming years, President Vladimir Putin said on Monday.







"In the coming years, it is necessary to actively build up the Navy's combat capabilities. This largely depends on the planned delivery of frigates and submarines upgraded for employing Tsirkon hypersonic missiles to the Navy's combat structure," the Russian leader said while opening the 14th series of meetings on defense.

This task requires achieving coordinated work of the government, the military command, the defense industry and research organizations, the president stressed.

The hypersonic weapons in the Fleet are becoming extremely important to maintain strategic stability, Putin noted.

The Russian leader also stressed the need to continue the deliveries of destroyers and universal amphibious assault ships to the Navy.

"I request you to report in detail today about how the work on ships of new projects and their armament is proceeding," Putin said, addressing the meeting's participants.

In his State-of-the-Nation Address to the Federal Assembly on February 20, Russian President Vladimir Putin said that the work on the Tsirkon hypersonic missile was proceeding as scheduled. As the Russian leader said, the Tsirkon is capable of developing a speed of Mach 9 and its striking range capability can exceed 1,000 km. The Russian leader also said that the Tsirkon could strike both naval and ground targets. Experts say the Tsirkon hypersonic missile cannot be intercepted by any existing air defense capabilities.

A source in the defense industry told TASS in late 2018 that more than ten Tsirkon launches had been carried out against naval targets to ranges of several hundred kilometers since the start of the missile's trials. According to media reports, the missile firings from a sea platform were conducted in 2016, 2017 and 2018.

Russian warships and submarines currently armed with Kalibr or Oniks cruise missiles are expected to carry Tsirkon hypersonic weapons. Russian Deputy Defense Minister Alexei Krivoruchko said on November 8 there were plans to deploy Tsirkon





missiles on the frigate Marshal Shaposhnikov currently undergoing modernization and on the Project 949A multi-purpose nuclear-powered submarine Irkutsk. Before that, Russian President Putin said that the corvette Gremyashchiy might be armed with Tsirkon hypersonic missiles.

Russian spy ship lurking off US coast conducting 'unsafe operation'

U.S. Northern Command and the Coast Guard have been tracking a Russian spy ship equipped with electronic surveillance gear that has been lurking off the East Coast of the United States.

On Monday, the Coast Guard sent out a Maritime Safety Information Bulletin warning boaters of reports of the Viktor Leonov operating in an "unsafe manner" off the coast of South Carolina and Georgia.

On Tuesday, the Coast Guard said the Russian ship was operating in USCG's Jacksonville, Florida, area of responsibility, which encompasses roughly 40,000 square miles of ocean and stretches nearly 190 miles of coast from

Kings Bay, Georgia, to Port Malabar, Florida.

"This unsafe operation includes not energizing running lights while in reduced visibility conditions, not responding to hails by commercial vessels attempting to coordinate safe passage and other erratic movements," the Coast Guard posted on its bulletin.

"Vessels transiting these waters should maintain a sharp lookout and use extreme caution when navigating in proximity to this vessel. Mariners should make reports of any unsafe situations to the United States Coast Guard," the Coast Guard said in its safety message.

Adm. James Foggo III, the commander of U.S. Naval Forces Europe and U.S. Naval Forces Africa, told reporters Dec. 18 that the Russian spy ship was operating a "couple hundred" miles off the East Coast.



North American Aerospace Defense
Command and U.S. Northern Command told
Military Times that they were tracking the
Russian ship. "We are aware of Russia's naval
activities, including the deployment of these
intelligence collection ships in the region," Maj.
Mark R. Lazane, a spokesman with
NORTHCOM, told Military Times in an emailed
statement. "While we won't discuss specific
measures being taken, NORAD and ORTHCOM
routinely conduct air and maritime operations to
ensure the defense of the United States and
Canada," Lazane said.

It's not the first time the Viktor Leonov has conducted intelligence operations off the East Coast off the U.S. In 2017, the Pentagon announced the Leonov was being trailed by a Coast Guard vessel but was operating in international waters.

"This is not something where we have seen where they have entered territorial waters, and as such it is lawful and very similar to operations we do," then-Pentagon spokesman Capt. Jeff Davis said about the Leonov in February 2017.

The Russian surveillance ship has been spotted conducting operations on the U.S. submarine base in New London, Connecticut, and other Navy bases in Florida and Virginia as far back as 1998, the Pentagon previously said. "They routinely deploy intelligence vessels worldwide to monitor the activities and particularly naval activities of other nations, but then again conducted lawfully in international waters and not unlike operations we conduct ourselves," Davis said in 2017 about the Leonov operating near the East Coast of the U.S. Foggo said that the Coast Guard reported that the Russian ship was not responding to signals or "bridge to bridge" radio communications and was running without lights on at sea. Those actions, Foggo said Wednesday, are risky.

"NORAD and USNORTHCOM closely track vessels of interest, including foreign military naval vessels such as the Russian ship VICTOR LEONOV, in our area of responsibility," Lazane said.
