We remember....



Boats Lost in January

USS S-36 (SS 141): Lost on January 20, 1942, with no loss of life, on her 2nd war patrol. She ran hard aground on a reef and radioed for help. The entire crew was rescued by a Dutch ship after they scuttled

USS S-26 (SS 131): Lost on January 24, 1942, with the loss of 46 officers and men in the Gulf of Panama, on her 2nd war patrol. She was rammed by the USS PC-460 and sunk within seconds. The CO, XO, and one lookout on the bridge, were the only survivors. USS ARGONAUT (SS 166): Lost on January 10, 1943, with the loss of 102 officers and men off Rabaul, on her 3rd war patrol. While attacking a convoy, she torpedoed a Japanese destroyer who along with 2 other destroyers depth-charged her. As she tried to surface, the destroyers sunk her by gunfire.

USS SCORPION (SS 278): Lost on January 5, 1944, with the loss of 77 officers and men in the East China Sea, on her 4th war patrol. It is assumed she was sunk by a mine.

USS SWORDFISH (SS 193): Lost on January 12, 1945, with the loss of 89 officers and men somewhere near Okinawa, on her 13th war patrol. Probably was lost to a mine.



The newest Submarine Hall of Fame Boat

USS ATLANTA (SSN 712)



Motto: Resurgens (Latin: "Rise Again")
Callsign: November - Alpha - Yankee - Foxtrot

USS ATLANTA had a short career of only 17 years. She was commissioned in March 1982 and Decommissioned in December 1999 through no fault of her own, it was due to the defense budget when she was due for refueling. However, during this relatively short career she accomplished many significant "Firsts" as well as successful clandestine operations of great importance in support of defending the United States during the Cold War.

- The First 688 Class Submarine to be certified to carry MK-48 Torpedo, MK-48 ADCAP Torpedo, Harpoon Missile, and the Tomahawk Cruise missile.
- During her second year of service ATLANTA spent 265 continuous days at sea in the Western Atlantic, that's just 5 days shy of nine months continuous sea time. (One of three very successful Western Atlantic Cruises.)
- She deployed for six highly successful Mediterranean Cruises, three Western Atlantic deployments and five Northern Runs.
- The First Nuclear Powered submarine to directly support an Amphibious Ready Group (ARG).
- In March of 1983, USS ATLANTA successfully fired a Harpoon missile at the Destroyer USS WOOD DD-715 off the coast of Puerto Rico with a live war-shot Harpoon missile. She won "Best ASW Unit" for her role in this exercise (READEX 1-83).
- In June of 1983, for a 'SinkEx' of USS BUSHNELL AS-15 USS ATLANTA launched two MK 48 war-shot torpedoes to successfully complete the sinking exercise. The initial tasking was for ATLANTA to fire one torpedo followed by a second from USS FINBACK SSN 670. However, FINBACK failed to launch their torpedo. Within 3 minutes of receiving the revised order ATLANTA fired a second war-shot torpedo to complete the sinking. This feat earned ATLANTA the highest tonnage ever to be sunk in peacetime as well as a "Clean Sweep".
- November 1983 ATLANTA passed all requirements and certifications becoming the first submarine authorized to deploy Submarine Launched Tomahawk Cruise Missiles.

- June 1984 ATLANTA became the very first Navy platform (not just submarine) certified to carry and deliver nuclear tipped Tomahawk cruise missiles. She had been outfitted with the necessary 'Over the Horizon' targeting systems just one year prior a remarkable achievement to complete in just one year given the rigorous requirements of nuclear armament.
- Fall 1984 ATLANTA launched a war-shot Harpoon missile into the Troop Transport ship USS CLINTON APA-144 as part of Readiness Exercise 2-84. She was awarded the "ASW – A" award from Submarine Squadron 8 for excellence.
- 1985 ATLANTA was chosen to be the test platform for the deployment mechanisms of a newly developed "Quick Strike Mine" system.
- November 1985 ATLANTA successfully conducted the East Coast's first launch of an 'Over the Horizon' TLAM (Tomahawk Land Attack Missile) to an inland target.
- April 1986 ATLANTA was called upon for Operation El Dorado Canyon The United States' bombing raid conducted in response to Libyan aggression in Berlin, more on that to follow.
- 1986 ATLANTA launched more torpedoes than any other boat in the squadron. In addition to her own operation schedule, ATLANTA was assigned to pick up PCO Operations when BATON ROUGE had a handling incident while loading out for that operation. ATLANTA also fired many MK 48s trying to resolve the problem of the wire getting caught in the screw. This involved trying many different firing angles, rudder orders, and even varied colors of wire to determine if it was any specific tube causing the problem. Along the same lines ATLANTA was also used to test a wire cutter back by the screw.
- January 1989 ATLANTA was chosen as the test platform against the Air and Surface fleet's new MK 50
 Torpedo which was designed for use against the Soviet Union's newest deep diving submarines. It was later
 determined as part of this testing that the MK 50 Torpedo was not a viable platform and therefore never
 went into production to the fleet. There is no measure available to calculate the amount of money saved by the
 fact that the MK 50 platform was never deployed.
- 1990 ATLANTA earned the National Defense Service Medal as part of the war against Iraq and terrorism.

OOD: "Officer of the Deck"

OOD: Sir, the night baker needs a steady boat to make tonight's cake"

Captain: "Oh"

Pause

Captain: "What kind of cake"?

OOD: "One moment Sir...Chief of the Watch, what kind of cake"?

COW: "Wait One..." *talking on the JA*

COW: "Hey, what kind of cake"?

Night Baker: "It's a Golden Sponge cake with Strawberry filling and Vanilla icing".

COW: "OK...Standby".

COW: "Officer of the Deck... It's a Golden Sponge cake with Strawberry filling and Vanilla icing".

OOD: "Very Well Chief"

on the Captains phone

00D: "Sir, It's a Golden Sponge cake with Strawberry filling and Vanilla icing".

Captain: "Mmmm...sounds good...keep me informed"

00D: "Keep you informed Aye Sir". *hangs up phone*

00D: "Chief of the Watch, inform the night baker we have a steady boat".

COW: "Inform the Night Baker we have a steady boat Aye Sir".

talking on the JA

COW: "You got a steady deck...let me know when you're done"

Night Baker: "You got it Chief"

...and that's how things are done on a Submarine.
